4	Discuss & Take Action on FY 2022-2023 Budget Proposal: The Chair of the Finance Committee will provide the committee's recommendation to the Board regarding approving the proposed FY 2022-2023 Budget. D. Thompson shared with the board the budget narrative, including strategies and goals. The FY 2022-2023 budget was designed on a cash flow model to indicate monthly projections of revenue and expenses. It was noted that this budget focuses on our programs and revenue, rather than the organization's existing capital. Main programs included in the budget: PTHS - Large Source of Revenue Micro lending Program Launch Asset Allocation Reorganization	Judy Clinco	A MOTION was made and seconded (S. Barton/ M. 	 Property Development Accelerator Real Estate Property Green Bank Lending Loan Fund Capital It was noted that the Tucson IDA took a conservative approach to the 2022-2023 budget, the Tucson IDA is projecting to be revenue positive this year. The Chair of the Finance Committee shared that the finance committee approved the budget as is.		
5	Discussion and Action on FY 2021-2022 Audit proceedings: The Chair of the Finance Committee will provide the committee's recommendation to the Board regarding how to proceed with the annual audit process. It was shared that the Finance Committee discussed two submissions for a new auditor. Both providers that submitted proposals have qualifying experience and similar costs. It was explained that the Finance Committee discussed the pros and cons of switching auditors this year versus next year. The committee agreed with the Tucson IDA CPA's recommendation that the same auditor from past years completes the Audit for this year so as not to require learning two distinct accounting systems in back to back years. 7	Capital Landscape Presentation: The Board will hear the presentation of Economic Policy Advisor Ian O'Grady regarding data on Tucson's capital landscape and upcoming opportunities for the Tucson IDA. I. O'Grady presented on the challenges faced by entrepreneurs in the current capital landscape and where the Tucson IDA can create opportunities in Tucson to bridge gaps regarding access to capital. The Tucson IDA has some specific advantages as a political subdivision of the state that reduce our overhead so we can increase our micro-lending volume quickly. In 1-2 years, the Tucson IDA focuses on micro lending and nonprofits. - Supply chain financing - Character-based lending In 2-3 years, the Tucson IDA continues with lending and attaining CDC status - Green Banking - Credit Enhancement In 3+ years, the Tucson IDA focuses on obtaining CDFI status I.
