Omar Garcia and Donovan Durband presented the April 2022 Financials. We heard a report on how the taxes collected on parking citations are split. ParkTucson has 1.5 million in cash with 1.4

million coming due to interest and principal payments. Revenue has returned to 79.7% of normal being considered 2019. Parking meter collections in March were over \$100,000 for the first time since 2019

The website is being redesigned and will incorporate the new city logo.

Parker Technology has been hired to resolve customer care issues in the garages after hours. Looking forward to FY23 there are deferred maintenance and security issues to resolve.
