LEGAL ACTION REPORT

1. Call to Order/Roll Call – Commission Chair Dale Calvert called the meeting to order at 5:31 p.m. Roll call was taken, and quorum was established, 7-3.

- **2. Approval of Minutes August 28, 2023** Commission member Jesse Lugo made a motion to approve the August 28, 2023 meeting minutes as submitted. Commission member Paul Smith seconded the motion. The meeting minutes were approved unanimously 7-0.
- 3. Call to the Audience No community members present wished to address the IOAC.

 This is the time when any member of the public may address the Independent Oversight and Accountability

- **4. Prop 101 Updates** Program Manager Jim DeGrood shared a PowerPoint presentation and provided an update with detailed information on packages in the Prop 101 program on Residential Streets and Arterial Streets projects. Discussion was held. No action was taken.
- **5. Prop 411 Updates** Program Manager Jim DeGrood shared a PowerPoint presentation and provided an update on Prop 411 projects. He talked about completed and on-going pavement projects, the completed resurfaced projects on the Neighborhood Streets Initial Projects List as well as work that is under contract/imminent, projects that are currently out to bid, and surface treatment packages. Mr. DeGrood also provided updated financial information through October 23, 2023 and discussed a variety of Next Steps for the program. Discussion was held. No action was taken.
- 6. Collector Street Update; Request for Approval Action: Approval of Old Spanish Trail Repaving Program Manager Jim DeGrood shared a PowerPoint presentation and provided information on Collector Street Program Project recommendations. Mr. DeGrood requested approving the repaving of Old Spanish Trail between Broadway and Harrison as well as recommend that the Complete Streets Coordinating Council (CSCC) consider concurrent reconstruction of the adjacent multi-use path with Prop 411 Safety Funds. Discussion was held.

Commission member Jesse Lugo motioned to approve the repaving of Old Spanish Trail between Broadway and Harrison as well as recommend that the Complete Streets Coordinating Council (CSCC) consider concurrent reconstruction of the adjacent multi-use path with Prop 411 Safety Funds. Commission member Bruce Burke seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously 7-0.

- 8. Complete Streets Coordinating Council Update Complete Streets Coordinating Council (CSCC) staff liaison Patrick Hartley mentioned the Prop 411 Mini-Grant Program which establishes an inclusive, community-led process to deliver traffic calming improvements to residential neighborhoods across the city, prioritizing under-resourced areas that could not otherwise fund their own traffic calming improvements via the existing Neighborhood Traffic Management Program. He shared the website where more information on the program could be obtained. Safe Streets Mini-Grant Program | Tucson Delivers (tucsonaz.gov) Mr. Hartley said the CSCC would be having their next meeting Wednesday, October 25, 2023 for anyone interested in attending. Discussion was held. No action was taken.
- **9. Future Meeting Date and Agenda Items** Commissioners discussed when the next meeting would be held and agreed on Monday, January 22, 2024 at 5:30 p.m., subject to room availability. Commissioners requested more information on Accelerating the resurfacing on Tucson Blvd, from 22nd to Broadway and/or 22nd to 6th St. and Collector Improvements on the Proposed Collector List that are on Move Tucson Project Tiers 1-3, further recommending the CSCC consider funding the Move Tucson recommended improvements with Prop 411 Safety funding. They also requested that the update on Tucson Water Utility Coordination efforts, which was tabled, be on the next agenda.
- 10. Adjournment Commission Chair Dale Calvert adjourned the meeting at 7:22 p.m.
