

Ariel Fry explained the "Santa Rita Park public art project" PA 3035 which is part of Proposition 407. The park will receive public artwork, a new splash pad, sports field renovations, and lighting, playground, restroom, ramadas, and walking path. Within Ward 5, borders Ward 1. Public Art Budget -\$36,014 – provides options for Murals, Mosaics and Metalwork on walkways, concrete surfaces and some walls fencing, splash pad and playground surfaces, and masonry. The 11-person panel includes nine (9) community members. Oliverio Balcells, a multimedia artist from Tempe was chosen by the panel. Balcells works in a diversity of mediums, his work relates to different generations, and he would reach out to the community through door-knocking and contacting small businesses individually.

Question from Maureen on how so many from the community on the project panel. Riel said there was a goal of at least 7 community members. They had a list of people from past projects and from the Ward offices and other outreach like Sister Jose's.

Jim asked if anyone else has questions. Adriane says she received an email about the submission of the Free Wall as part of this panel's review process. Why did it not make it to the top three (3) choices. Ariel says the panel reviewed all

application votes online and in the 1<sup>st</sup> Artist's selection meeting, it was noted that the Free Wall didn't receive enough votes to reach the threshold for consideration. Motion to accept the Artist made by Maureen Lueck; second by Bob Clark. Approved unanimously via roll call vote.
