### 4. Approval of Legal Action Report for March 13, 2024

# 6. Committee Reports

#### a. Southern Arizona Veteran's Affairs Health Care System (SAVAHCS)

Jennifer Gutowski, Director of SAVAHCS provided a report on behalf of SAVAHCS.

Jennifer Gutowski mentioned a few important dates Friday, April 12, 2024, is a memorial service honoring veterans who have passed away, from 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. Tuesday, April 23, 2024, will be the quarterly congressional VSO and stakeholder meeting from 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. Volunteer Recognition BBQ will be on Wednesday, April 24, 2024, from 2:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. The Center for Development and Civic Engagement is looking for volunteers for the summer. Beginning March 5, 2025, Veterans who were exposed to toxins while serving in the military may be eligible to enroll directly into VA healthcare.

# b. Arizona Veterans' Memorial Cemetery

Committee Member Hollis reported there was going to be one missing in America interment on Saturday, April 13, 2024, at 10:00 a.m., and on Friday, April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2024, a World War 2 missing in America interment, and this will be at 12:00 p.m. Both are located at the Veterans Cemetery.

# c. Arizona Department of Veterans' Services

#### d. Council Woman Lee, Ward 4

Council Woman Lee mentioned she formed the first employee resource group within the City of Tucson and the veterans. A leadership group was elected to run the employee resource group and Council Woman Lee serves as the executive sponsor. The group is focused on how to continue to create opportunities around Veterans Day and Marine Crops birthdays. Anything to bring the troops together and allow them to build relationships across departments in the City of Tucson's organization. Council Woman Lee also mentioned that the Skillbridge program was launched inside the City about 2 years ago. It allows transitioning service members to work for an organization for up to 180 days before their separation or retirement from the military. The goal is to make the interns permanent employees with the City of Tucson, and they are working with Human Resources on that so that they do not need to go out and find new employment after 6 months.

Discussion was held, and no formal action was taken.

#### 7. Memorial for Vietnam Veteran Memorial Park – Update/Discussion

Committee Member Morgan mentioned that they had a nice turnout on Friday, March 29, 2024. They plan to have the plaque up with the engraving by next year on March 29, 2025.

# 8. 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Vietnam War – Update/Discussion

Committee Member Morgan stated that the event will take place at the Desert Diamond Casino on March 29, 2025. La Catina will set up a buffet for the event and the Committee members must think of ways to fundraise \$11,000 for the event.
