Staff Notes:

Tom Janowitz presented two alternate revenue and fund allocation calculation methods for the NRP program.

Both alternate methods involve removing the 25% participation threshold and applying the year's current neighborhood participation % to the revenue totals, as well as removing the overall RPP program solvency (\$4,000 surplus) criteria. Alternate 1 involves reducing non-residential permit revenue contributions from 100% to 10% to the individual neighborhood funds. Alternate 2 involves placing a \$3,000 cap on annual individual fund revenue accumulation.

Richard and Dale would like a copy of the excel documents.

Jim suggests it's easier to maintain if it goes into it's own cost center or bank account.

Valaria is asking if the cost of the RPPs will be going up in price as some people are stating that they can't afford it.

Jeannine is asking what efforts PT is making to encourage participation.

Valeria is suggesting that landlords offer RPP to their renters.

Zach asked what is the hope after digesting this information are we voting on this next meeting? Richard does think PT is honoring the RPP and thinks there is massive misunderstanding in the language.

Cindy is commenting on the participation of the RPP in JP sitting on 40% renters and students and 60% homeowners and it's hard to get JP residents to participate.

Aaron is stating that NU is getting shafted.

Graeme is asking if the option to opt in or opt out it in the language and wanted to know the historical language of the program.

Valeria suggested we change the spaces in the neighborhoods to meters.

Jeffrey stated that if we don't have enough enforcement, it doesn't work and that we need more agents.
