- 6) Ornamental (Nonfunctional) Turf Rebate Update Candice Rupprecht presented an update on the progress of the ornamental non-functional turf removal and replacement rebate. A few news stories featured the ordinance the week of June 10, which drove interest to the website and the turf removal interest form. The website and rebate kick-off on July 1, 2024. The feature article will go out in Water Matters beginning July 1st. the formal process, as I mentioned last month, will be through planning and development services and so that the customer will submit a landscape plan review that gets reviewed by



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a landscape architect over there and then it will, they'll get a notice to proceed. They'll have 90 days to do the installation, we've been working with planning and development services, making sure that we're clear on how that works as well. And I know we talked a bit last month about the different uh pricing parameters for the rebate. Uh, we are sticking with the \$5 per square foot up to 20,000 square feet per property. Uh, we have, I think I shared that we have the tree incentive. So we are keeping that, you know customers can plant trees within the removal area and get \$100 per 15 gallon tree or larger and then the water harvesting piece is the additional bonus incentive and that is similar to the residential program.
