2. Invocation

The invocation was provided by Commissioner Hayes.

3. Introduction of Guests – Update/Discussion

a. Jennifer Gutowski, Southern Arizona Veterans Affairs Health Care System

Ms. Wasielewski informed the Committee that her boss Steven Braverman, The Vision 22 Network Director, has been selected for the position of Chief Operating Officer, and his temporary replacement will be Miss Steph Young for 120 days as acting network director. She is the director at Asheville VA. Ms. Wasielewski also shared the current associate director for patient care services. Doctor Cassandra Valdez has been selected for the chief nursing position at the network level effective February 9th so they will be searching for her replacement.

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Ms. Wasielewski also informed the VAC committee they would have an MLK remembrance walk at the main facility on Tuesday, January 14th, 2025. If additional information is needed advised to reach out to Orlando Ford. She informed the VAC Committee they have their quarterly mental health open house on Thursday, January 30th, 2025, from 10 am to 12 pm in building 4 conference rooms A and B to provide Veterans with mental health information. Also, on January 30th, 2025, from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m., they will be hosting their Quarterly Congressional VSO and Stakeholder meeting in building A4 conference room which will be a hybrid meeting. Ms. Wasielewski ended by asking the Committee to please continue to share opportunities for outreach in the community.

Ms. Wasielewski introduced the new chief of Community Development and Engagement (CDCE) Monica Oxford.

Ms. Oxford introduced herself to the VAC committee and gave a brief introduction about herself.

c. Military Lounge and Operation Exodus

d. Memorial for Vietnam Veteran Memorial Park / $50^{\rm th}$ Anniversary of the Vietnam War

Jim Barnhart with the Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 106 is going to dedicate a black granite memorial to the 107 Pima County who lost their lives in action in Vietnam and will be dedicated on March 29th, 2025 at 9 a.m. at the Kino Veterans Memorial Park also a free luncheon will be provided to the first 200 Vietnam Veterans at the Desert Diamond Casino.

Discussion was held, and no formal action was taken.

e. Memorial for Vietnam Veteran Memorial Park

Commissioner Byron briefed the committee on the memorial for the 107 Pima County residents who were killed in action in Vietnam. The plaques are planned to be installed before March 29, 2025. A dedication ceremony will be held at Kino Veteran Memorial Park and a free luncheon will be provided to Vietnam Veterans.

f. Four Chaplains Ceremony 2025

Commissioner Byron informed the Committee the Four Chaplains Ceremony is in the works. and mentioned that they are still looking for volunteer Wreath layers.

The 25th Annual Nighthawk 72 Memorial Service for the 19 Marines who lost their lives at the Marana Regional Airport. The ceremony is scheduled for April 5th, 2025, at 10 a.m. with a candlelight ceremony to follow at 8 p.m. The Committee is still looking for volunteer wreath layers for the ceremony.
