#### 2. Golf Surcharge

#### Surcharge Outline

- A. An additional fee added to every round of golf.
- B. Annual passes would also get a flat surcharge.
- C. Considering a range from \$1-2
- D. Likely requires Mayor and Council approval and incorporation into Tucson City Golf fees.

#### Prioritization process

- A. Potential survey to golfers/suggestion box.
- B. Input provided by the Tucson Greens Committee, OB Sports and city staff resulting in a ranking and prioritization.
- C. Priority ranking completed annually.
- D. Prioritization completed by July, to be publicized at the beginning of the fiscal year.
- E. Final priority posted at each course with list of anticipated improvements.
- F. Define approach for spreading improvements across all golf courses.

- A. Refurbishing bunkers
- B. Refurbishing bridges
- C. Improving restrooms
- D. Repairing cart paths
- E. Course improvements ball washers, tee signs
- F. Tee leveling
- G. Replacing televisions
