## Background

At the Study Session on March 5, 2024, staff presented Mayor and Council with additional information to help inform the conversations regarding fare-free transit, including the following: ridership trends by mode, Sun Tran service adjustments for public schools, ridership estimates for the University of Arizona (UA), Tucson Unified School District (TUSD), and Pima Community College (PCC), fare collection scenarios, and key activities and a timeline needed for fare implementation.

### **Funding Options**

#### Rental Car Ta

- The Arizona Constitution prohibits municipalities, including the City of Tucson, from imposing a citywide tax on rental cars.
- Pima County can impose a rental car surcharge, since it acts as a Sports
  Authority District; all collections must be used for County sports facilities.

#### Hotel/Motel Surcharg

- The City of Tucson currently imposes a hotel tax, "Transient Rental Tax," (6.0%) and an additional Hotel/Motel Surcharge (\$4.00/night).
- Mayor and Council can increase both the Transient Rental Tax as well as the Hotel/Motel Surcharge in the manner that is compliant with ARS 9-499.15.
- Any increase to the Transient Rental Tax (Tucson Code 19-66(a)), which is currently at 6.0%, must be used for the promotion of tourism, per state statute (ARS 9-500.06(c)).
- Any increase to the Hotel/Motel Surcharge (Tucson Code 19-66(b)), which
  is currently at \$4.00/night, has the flexibility to be used for any general
  fund purpose.
  - It is worth noting that every \$1.00/night collects approximately \$2M.

## **Funding Options**

#### Local Transportation Assistance Fund (LTAF)

- Via the Arizona Lottery, prior to fiscal year 2012 two funding mechanisms were in place:
  - 1. LTAF I non-Powerball receipts
  - 2. LTAF II Powerball receipts
- From FY2007 through FY2011, the City of Tucson received over \$10.7M from LTAF I and II.
- During the 2011 AZ Legislature session, to fill the State's budget shortfall, the AZ Legislature repealed the LTAF program, leaving the City of Tucson and many other jurisdictions at a significant financial loss.
- Maricopa County re-established funding through a claim failed against ADEQ.
- During the Nov. 14, 2012, Mayor and Council Study Session, the City Council
  voted unanimously in favor of seeking to reinstate LTAF funding; however,
  those efforts never materialized.

#### What is Sun Van?

- Shared-ride, public transportation service for people who have a disability that prevents them from using Sun Tran or Sun Link
- Must be found eligible before using service
- Service provided to/from destinations within ¾ mile of Sun Tran and Sun Link routes during times these services operate
- Premium service offered to destinations and hours beyond requirements when available



#### Other Accessibility Investments

- Bus and Streetcar Fleet Fully Accessible
  - Wheelchair accessible
  - Stop announcements
- Sun Link Stations Fully Accessible
  - Level boarding
  - Accessible service information
- ADA Bus Stop Improvements
- Vehicle Operator Accessibility Training
- Accessible Rider Training



#### Recent Sun Van Trends

- Cost per Boarding has increased 44% between 2015 and 2022
- Annual trips decreased during pandemic, but are approaching prepandemic levels



## **Emerging Mobility Options**

- Need for specialized transportation services may exceed traditional Sun Van service
- Identify mobility options for seniors, persons with disabilities, and other transit-dependent populations not currently served by Sun Van or Sun Tran
- Opportunity for new service options including expanded Sun OnDemand microtransit and transportation network companies (Uber, Lyft)



## Community Meetings & Survey

- We want to hear from you about:
  - o What Sun Van is doing well and where we can improve
  - o Your mobility needs that are not being met
  - What transportation providers would you use and how often
  - What would you would be willing to pay for new mobility services
- Survey results will be summarized and used to develop draft recommendations for Sun Van and other mobility improvements






