3. **Introduction of Guests – Update/Discussion**

a. **Maria Nguyen, Southern Arizona Veterans Health Care System**

Ms. Nguyen briefed the committee on some of the activities from the SAVAHCS February 2026 Directors Report. Ms. Nguyen started her report with the National Salute to Veteran Patients Week and thanked the committee for all they do every day. She also touched on the Groundbreaking for the new Yuma VA outpatient Clinic scheduled to open in 2027, they also had a grand opening for the SAVAHCS Chapel at the Tucson campus. Ms. Nguyen talked about the upcoming SAVAHCS Mental Open House scheduled for Thursday, February 19, 2026, at 10 in the morning and provided the committee with the location and a phone number to RSVP. She reported they are still looking for volunteer drivers for their Sierra Vista and Yuma offices. Ms. Nguyen concluded by advising the committee about an email and text scam they have been alerted to and provided tips and steps if the commissioners or anyone they know receive any suspicious messages asking for personal information.

6. VAC Savings and Checking Account – Update/ Discussion

Commissioner Byron informed the committee Wells Fargo will be updating their policies and begin charging a \$15 fee for any accounts that don't maintain a \$2,000+ balance. The committee voted to replace the checking account with a savings account. The motion was moved by Commissioner Byron, duly seconded by Commissioner Burks, and passed by a roll call vote of 8 to 0 to approve the transfer to a Wells Fargo savings account.

Discussion was held, and formal action was taken.

7. Committee Reports

a. Arizona Veterans' Memorial Cemetery

Commissioner Byron reported the cemetery administration has 69 internments, 43 Veterans, 1 Guardsman, 25 Dependents, 9 Burial urns, 9 Casketed and 51 Columbarium's and a total of 5,178 total interred. She also informed the "Missing in America Project" is scheduled for April 18th at 10 a.m. and a Construction Kickoff is scheduled for January 14th with additional information to follow.

Commissioner Byron informed the committee there are no updates for the parade yet, but it is scheduled for November 11, 2026, at 11 a.m. with the parade route staying the same due to construction. Commissioner Young reported the memorial project is moving faster than anticipated and they will be meeting with the CEO and Vice CEO on February 25, 2026, to review concepts for the memorial.

The committee voted to leave the Junior Vice Chair seat open to confirm with former Commissioner Ann Hollis if she will be looking to be reappointed to the committee before appointing someone else. The motion was made by Commissioner Byron and duly seconded by Commissioner Ruiz.

13. **Consideration/Approval of Member – Update/Discussion**

The committee voted to move forward with the appointment of Lieutenant Colonel Brenda S. Lieutenant Colonel Brenda Hughey appointment will be added to the March 3, 2026, Mayor and Council meeting for final approval.
