Potentially we can discuss and vote on a letter to City/County leadership. Given that the RTA votes will be counted on March 10th, this might be too short for the committee to discuss and vote on a letter. Potential alternatives: (1) We might still be able to vote on a letter today. (2) We call for a special meeting later in February. (3) Members are encouraged to write their own (personal) letters and also note that they are a BAC member. (Overall, this is likely less impactful / less likely to sway opinion). (4) We send a letter after the vote has happened/ at some later point in time.

Note: the final time that Mayor & Council will be meeting before the RTA Vote will be on March 3rd, and we would need to get an approved letter to them on Friday, February 27th at the latest.
