**1. Call to Order/Roll Call**

Meeting called to order at 10:31 a.m. – roll call done and present were: Commissioner Lamb, chairperson, Commissioner Minor, Commissioner Kubish, and Commissioner Trejo.

**2. LAR Approval**

The Minutes for 12-10-2026 was reviewed for approval. Commissioner Minor moved to accept, Commissioner Trejo seconded, the vote was unanimous.

**3. Outreach and Training Materials, and Opportunities**

There was continuing discussion about National Alliance of Preservation Commissions training opportunities.

Commissioners Lamb and Kubish are in touch with Emily Freeman – Boulder CO who is scheduled to give a presentation on Deconstruction and a Circular Economy on May 5 at noon Arizona time. There were some issues with the notification for the first webinar given by Stephanie - San Antonio. There were only nine participants. However, it was recorded and will be available to commission members and city and county staff and Boards in the future.

Commissioner Kubish commented that some may not see the deconstruction presentations as relevant since no such program currently exists in Tucson.

#### **4. Training Development**

Commissioner Trejo is continuing to identify the steps and paperwork to be completed for TPCHC to host training for realtors and for attendees of this possible training to receive education credits.

#### **5. Training Participation**

There is no funding for the Arizona Preservation Conference to be held this year. This is unfortunate as the sessions provide very good training opportunities.

Commissioner Lamb is continuing to search for a method to track attendees to this and NAPC webinars. These sessions are mandatory, although that is not well understood. Could participants possibly email Terry after viewing the webinars? There is no charge for commissioners and other government officials to view the webinars, but it is necessary to specify that one has a TPCHC organizational membership. Attendance at the above should be encouraged at future TPCHC meetings. Commissioner Lamb has asked Commissioners Kubish and Minor to share comments about NAPC webinars and training resources.

Concerns related to transportation impacts were discussed. Is there a related training topic that would be relevant? Working with the Transportation Subcommittee regarding this could be good. Could the Transportation Subcommittee or the Commission reach out to the RTA Next board again regarding historic preservation being represented. Past request was unsuccessful.

Commissioner Lamb and Emily Freeman had an introductory zoom call to discuss Ms. Freeman's upcoming webinar and tailor her talk to our needs. She suggested making a list of people "of interest" and deciding on the lens with which to view deconstruction – climate? Environmental? Try to get to know community values. Ms. Freeman mentioned the Build/ReUse conference in Phoenix this November and highly recommended attendance.
