Legal Action Report

1. Call to Order/Roll Call

A quorum was established. 2. Approval of Minutes: January 28, 2026, CSCC Meeting

4. RTA Next Letter Discussion

5. Pima County Transportation Master Plan

Samuel Paz presented an overview of the development of Pima County's first long-range transportation master plan, including its 18 to 24-month timeline,

multimodal scope, and ongoing community engagement efforts such as public events, surveys, and an interactive mapping tool. Discussion included questions regarding community outreach, the role of road widening in county contexts, integration with existing transportation frameworks, and how the plan will inform future funding and policy decisions.

A discussion ensued and no formal action was taken.

6. Funding Request: Sahuara & Copper/Flower Bike Boulevards

Staff presented a funding request to support completion of two bike boulevard projects leveraging federal funds and improving safety and connectivity.

A motion was made by Marshall Davis, duly seconded by James Wood, to approve funding up to \$1M to complete construction of the Sahuara and Copper/Flower Bike Boulevards; all approved.
