- 1. Call to Order/Roll Call** – Commission Vice Chair Ian Johnson called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Roll call was taken, and quorum was established, 6-3.

2. Call to the Audience (10 minutes) – One member of the community addressed the IOAC members.

- Gayle Hartmann – Sam Hughes Neighborhood Association is requesting rehabilitation on 5th/6th Street between Campbell and Country Club

This is the time when any member of the public may address the Independent Oversight and Accountability Commission. Due to time constraints, the total time allocated for this is 10 minutes. Individuals are allowed three (3) minutes each. Due to Open Meeting Law, Commission Members cannot discuss topics that are not on the agenda. Items brought up by the public may be considered as an agenda item for a future meeting.

3. Prop 101 Updates – Mr. DeGrood thanked the commission for their approval on the transfer of funds from the residential component to the arterial component of Prop 101. There was a public hearing held on April 7, 2026 where the City of Tucson approved resolution R24100. Mr. DeGrood mentions the potential for including Church Ave from Broadway Blvd to Pennington in future Prop 101 additions, to support a continuously high-quality surface along Church Ave. This recommendation will be provided once the bids for the Prop 101 projects commence. Discussion was held. **No action was taken.**

4. Arterial and Collector Street Needs – Program Manager Jim DeGrood presented information regarding recommended arterial and collector roadway projects for Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) funding consideration. Mr. DeGrood mentioned that Mayor and Council voted unanimously to approve the recommendations that the IOAC be given the charge to identify the projects that will be included in the RTA Next Program.

Mr. DeGrood shared the list and map of recommended arterial and collector roads that were selected based on Overall Condition Index (OCI), as well as sharing financial information related to the selected roadways.

The following motions were then presented to the commission:

Suggested motion: Approval of the recommended list of projects for rehabilitation using RTANext funding, together with the secondary potential projects list. This list shall be reviewed/modified annually. Projects selected for rehabilitation shall be drawn from this list for the following year's program.

Commission member Bruce Burke made a motion to approve the recommended list and secondary potential projects. Commission member Colin Oglesbee seconded the motion. **Motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.**

Suggested motion: Approval of the FY 27 Arterial and Collector Road Rehabilitation Program.

Commission member Colin Oglesbee made a motion to amend the FY27 Arterial & Collector Road Rehabilitation Program to include Wrightstown Road from Pantano Road to Speedway Boulevard. Commission member Dale Calvert Seconded the motion.

Amendment passed by majority roll call vote.

Commission member Bruce Burke made a motion to approve the amended FY27 Arterial and Collector Road Rehabilitation Program. Commission member Colin Oglesbee seconded the motion. **The amended motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.**

5. **Future Meeting Date and Agenda Items** - Commissioners discussed when the next meeting would be held and agreed on Monday, June 22, 2026, at 5:30 p.m., subject to room availability.
6. **Adjournment** – Commission Vice Ian Johnson adjourned the meeting at 6:30 p.m.
