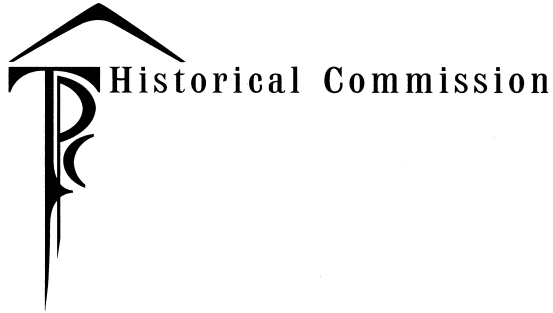




**TUCSON – PIMA COUNTY HISTORICAL COMMISSION
Transportation Subcommittee**

Summary of Minutes

1. Call to Order / Roll Call

The meeting was called to order by Chair Lozano at 12:10 p.m., and a quorum was present.

2. Land Acknowledgment Statement

Acknowledgment was given by Chair Lozano. No discussion was held.

**3. Approval of Transportation Subcommittee Legal Action Report/
Minutes from meeting(s) of: 05/20/26 (discussion/action)**

It was moved by Commissioner Lamb, and duly seconded by Commissioner Lozano, and carried by a roll call vote of 2 to 0 to approve the Legal Action Report/Minutes of the Transportation Subcommittee meeting of 05/20/26.

4. City of Tucson DTM and/or RTA Construction Projects within City

Transportation Subcommittee: 06/17/2026

Limits (discussion/action)

Chair Lozano discussed the 1st Avenue Project's Design Concept Report (DCR), pointing out the lack of a historic resource inventory or a detailed alignment. He questioned the methodology used to determine the current alignment. Commissioner Scoville noted that his recommendation to develop the Navajo Wash north of Fort Lowell Road was not included in the designs. Chair Lozano offered to e-mail the Project Manager Patrick Hartley regarding these matters. Commissioner Lamb listed several historic resources threatened by the Prince Road Project. No action was taken.

5. Pima County and/or RTA Construction Projects Outside of Tucson (discussion/action)

Commissioner Lamb gave updates on the RTA Colossal Cave Road Project and related development in and around Vail. She reaffirmed her willingness to serve on RTA CART if appointed. No action was taken

6. Threats to the Historic Commercial Corridor without Right of Way changes (discussion/action)

Chair Lozano discussed the blocks of boarded-up businesses on Broadway. Commissioner Scoville gave an update on the Fox Theatre Project. No action was taken.

7. Historic Route 80 Updates Including: Catalina, Miracle Mile, City of South Tucson, Benson Highway, Vail (discussion/action)

Commissioner Lamb discussed interest in Historic Route 80 by the Daughters of the American Revolution. Commissioner Scoville gave an update on the Hacienda Motel project on Miracle Mile. Chair Lozano gave an update on the burned-down Spanish Trail Motel on Benson Highway in South Tucson and offered to coordinate with Commissioners Trejo and Christopher who were also interested in possible salvage of remaining historic elements. No action was taken.

8. ADOT Updates Including: I-10, I-11 (miles 233-296), U.S. and State Routes, etc. (discussion/action)

Chair Lozano explained the significance of the ADOT reevaluation of the I-11 Tier 1 EIS. No action was taken.

9. Plans and Policies Updates (discussion/action)

No discussion was held. No action was taken.

10. Utility Infrastructure Affecting Historic Roads/Commercial Corridors (discussion/action)

Commissioner Lamb gave an update on Project Blue, in close proximity to the Butterfield Stage Route. Chair Lozano gave a (final?) update on the TEP 138kv power poles. No action was taken.
