5. Review of TPD Investigations:

1. Case # 25-0082

It was moved by Commissioner Chair Kate Calhoun and duly seconded by Commissioner Nancy Huff. Passed by a roll call vote of 3 to 0, (Vice Chair Annabelle Nuñez abstained from voting), to find Case #25-0082, to have been a fair and thorough investigation.

2. Case # 25-0136

It was moved by Commissioner Chair Kate Calhoun, duly seconded by Commissioner Nancy Huff. Passed by a roll call vote of 3 to 0, (Vice Chair Annabelle Nuñez abstained from voting), to find Case #25-0136, to have been a fair and thorough investigation.

The motion passed by a vote of 3 to 0.

3. Case # 25-0613

It was moved by Commissioner Nancy Huff, duly seconded by Commissioner Chair Kate Calhoun and passed by a roll call vote of 3 to 0, (Vice Chair Annabelle Nuñez abstained from voting), to find Case #25-0613, to have been a fair and thorough investigation.

The motion passed by a vote of 3 to 0.

6. Tucson Police Department:

A. TPD Updates regarding events or developments relating to TPD during the prior month

Lt. Jesse Chamberlain filled in for Assistant Chief James Wakefield and provided an update regarding several initiatives, including increasing police presence in parks and recreation

areas, coordinating with Parks and Recreation for cleanup efforts, and improving lighting in these areas. The discussion also included potential improvements to the 311 non-emergency call system to increase efficiency, including implementing a screening process to categorize incoming calls based on established criteria and facilitate a more appropriate and timelier response.

B. Office of Professional Standards/ Updates regarding events or developments relating to the Office of Professional Standards during the prior month.

An update was provided regarding the 110 cases currently open and in various stages of investigation. It was noted that these cases will be reviewed and may be cleared using body-worn camera footage. It was also reported that two grievances have been filed concerning members who received disciplinary action. These matters will be brought before the Grievance Board in September. Additionally, a Civil Service Board meeting will be held during the second week of September regarding a member whose employment was terminated. The meeting will be open to the public.

7. Office of Independent Police Auditor

Ex-Officio Mitch Kagen met with Assistant Chief Silva regarding the Aerial Emergency Response Pilot Program. The discussion included scenarios in which a drone may observe a potential crime while en route to a 911 call, as well as the privacy policies and procedures for the program, which is yet to be determined. It was also reported that approximately 70% of the calls received by Ex-Officio Mitch Kagen are not processed further as they primarily involve individuals seeking to express concerns or grievances rather than reporting an emergency or incident requiring a further response.

8. CPARB Vacancies.

Ward 6 has filled their CPARB vacancy.

CPARB vacancies now include Mayor and Ward 1.

9. Future Agenda Items

Chair Kate Calhoun requested that future agenda items include downtown fall events, focusing on Tucson Police Department resources, event operations, and resource implementation.
